CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of the MTNA Board of Directors was called to order by MTNA President Scott McBride Smith at 9:14 a.m. on March 15, 2019.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes from the December 2018 meeting of the Board were entered into the record, the documents having been approved unanimously as submitted via email vote on December 20, 2018.

The minutes of the January 10, 2019 and January 18, 2019 electronic meetings were approved as submitted.

OFFICER REPORTS

Written reports were received from the following National Officers: President Scott McBride Smith, President-elect Martha Hilley, Vice President Peter Mack, Secretary-Treasurer Debra Florian, and Immediate Past President Rebecca Johnson.

During the Officer reports, President Scott McBride Smith gave an update on MTNA China and the invitation to join the Global Music Education League formed by China Conservatory.

Secretary-Treasurer Debra Florian recognized Executive Director & CEO Gary Ingle to present an overview of the February 28, 2019 financial reports. Assets of MTNA are \$4,977,783. 25 with liabilities of \$34,248,24. The balance of the MTNA Trust account is \$895,496.20. The Foundation Fund Endowment account has assets of \$1,716,355.11 and the McHose Trust has assets of \$629,498.36. Income is \$2,379,880 with expenses of \$1,377,932,97. Ingle's presentation included his financial projections for the fiscal year end.

DIRECTORS REPORTS

Written reports from all seven Division Directors were reviewed: Janice Razaq (East Central Division), Nanette Solomon (Eastern Division), Cindy Peterson-Peart (Northwest Division), Sharon Callahan (South Central Division), Diane Blanchard (Southern Division), Geri Gibbs (Southwest Division), and Jill Hanrahan (West Central Division).

President Smith thanked the Directors for their hard work and "grassroots" efforts.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR & CEO REPORT

Executive Director & CEO Gary Ingle reviewed his written report as follows:

Federal Trade Commission

- MTNA continues to comply with all the terms and specific actions required by the FTC Decision and Order (Consent Decree).
- All state and local affiliate presidents received a copy of the MTNA Antitrust Compliance Guide on March 6, 2019.
- The Five-Year Compliance Report is in the process of being written. The report will be filed on or before April 3, 2019.
- The five-year anniversary of the FTC Consent Order and Decree is April 3, 2019. At that time, many of the requirements in the order expire. On that date, MTNA is no longer required to:
 - 1. Post and maintain on the Code of Ethics page of MTNA's website an FTC agreement statement, the FTC Settlement Statement, and a link to the FTC's website.
 - 2. Distribute electronically a copy of the FTC Settlement Statement to its leaders, employees, and Affiliates.
 - 3. Distribute electronically a copy of the FTC Settlement Statement to each new Affiliate, new members, and renewing members.
 - 4. Provide in-person annual training to its leaders and employees concerning MTNA's obligations under the order and an overview of the Antitrust Laws as they apply to MTNA's activities, behaviors, and conduct.
 - 5. Conduct a presentation at each annual meeting of MTNA and the State President's Advisory Council that summarizes MTNA's obligations under the order and provide context-appropriate guidance on compliance with the Antitrust Laws.

- 6. Provide an antitrust compliance guide to Affiliates to use at each annual meeting of the Affiliates that summarizes MTNA's obligations under this order and provides context-appropriate guidance on compliance with Antitrust Laws.
- 7. File a verified written report with the Federal Trade Commission setting forth in detail the manner and form in which MTNA has complied with the order.

The remaining obligations in the FTC Consent Order and Decree are ongoing until 2034, including maintaining its antitrust compliance program, appointing an Antitrust Compliance officer, terminating until remedied any affiliate that engages in any prohibited practice, disciplining any leader or employee who fail to comply with the order, and not placing any restrictions on solicitation of music teaching work.

Board and Governance.

• The voting process for National Officers concluded on March 1. A total of 1,164 members voted. Online and email votes accounted for 95% of the total votes cast. The following candidates received a majority of the votes in their respective positions and have been certified as MTNA National Officers for the 2019-21 biennium. Their terms of office will begin on March 20, 2019 at the conclusion of the 2019 MTNA National Conference.

- An MTNA Diversity and Inclusion Statement and Policy is still under development.
- President-elect Martha Hilley and he attended the Symposium for Chief Executive and Chief Elected Officers in Orlando, Florida on February 7-8, 2019. The event is a program of the American Society for Association Executives to provide an opportunity for the two leaders to explore how to best work together to effectively and efficiently carry out the association's mission to enhance future success. Every president-elect and he have attended this symposium since 1999.

Conferences and Meetings

- The eighth MTNA Collegiate Chapters Piano Pedagogy Symposium was held on January 4-5, 2019, at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Virginia. The event was quite successful, in large part because of the exceptional work of Chapter President Arielle Suhkram, and the entire JMU Collegiate Chapter. A total of 158 registered for the event. an increase of 29 or 22% from the previous year in Austin. The breakdown of attendees was as follows:

 - 11 Student Nonmembers
 - 35 Active Members

- The 2019 National Conference in Spokane, Washington was the primary focus of the staff's attention after the Collegiate Symposium. The responsibility for managing the thousands of moving parts falls to Brian Shepard and Tonya Schauer, both of whom are highly competent and experienced in all things related to the conference. The conference

will feature over 100 sessions, showcases, teaching demonstrations and master classes on topics ranging from teaching methods, literature, and performance to entrepreneurship, studio management and business practices. An extensive Exhibit Hall of print music, instruments, software and pedagogical materials; the MTNA Student Competitions; and Pedagogy Saturday round out the event. The internationally-renowned pianist, Ingrid Fliter, and the Transcontinental Saxophone Quartet will highlight the evening recitals. The conference keynote address will be given by noted musicologist, Alan Walker. Master classes will be led by well-known pedagogues Barry Snyder and Helen Marlais.

International

- On January 25, 2019, Ingle attended a meeting in San Gabriel, California, with representatives of MTNA China and Yamaha China to foster cooperation and partnership between the two organizations. He joined Jeffrey Fang and Charles Hung in engaging with a dozen significant Chinese piano teachers and Yamaha China staff for the event.
- On February 21, 2019, MTNA President Scott McBride Smith and he met with Janice Englehart, Cultural Affairs specialist, and Benjamin Sand, Assistant Cultural Affairs Officer for the U. S. Embassy in Beijing, China. The purpose of the meeting was to inform the embassy of MTNA's activities in China, especially as they relate to MTNA China. Englehart and Sand were very appreciative of our visit, and offered insights into the Chinese culture and the U. S. relationship with the Chinese government. In addition, they offered the use of embassy facilities and other assistance for any event we may want to have in China.
- On February 22, 2019, they met with Liguang Wang, president of the China Conservatory of Music. President Wang is the founder and chairman of the Global Music Education League (GMEL), a global nongovernmental nonprofit academic organization of 30 top music institutions from North America, Europe, Oceania, and Asia. The purpose is to build an academic community and a platform for world-class training, research, creation and performance and communication and cooperation among music institutions. MTNA was invited to become a member of this important organization, and this meeting represented our entry into the League.

• MTNA again partnered with *Americans for the Arts* as a sponsor of Arts Advocacy Day in Washington D.C. on March 4-5, 2019. It is the day members of the arts community from all across the country converge to advocate for the arts with members of Congress.

Programs

- Implementation of the eFestival program continues to progress. The registration fee was reduced to \$25 by eliminating substantial overhead including the use of Accept'd and the part-time eFestival Director position. The number of participants remain dismal.
- The MTNA Webinars continue to be popular. On January 25, 2019, Rebecca Pennington and Amy Glennon presented "Music in Every Child; Strategies for Success." It was attended by a total of 444 teachers, the fourth largest attendance since the beginning in 2015. On February 15, 2019, Jonathan Kuuskoski presented "Ready to Launch: Entrepreneurial Tools for Your Studio.
- *Music Teacher Monday* is an innovative, once-a-month, online continuing education opportunity for the time-challenged music teacher. On February 4, 2019, MTNA live streamed on Facebook a master class with Michael Chertock, professor of piano and piano department chair at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music. Chertock provided tips and ideas for teaching Beethoven's Sonata Op. 10, No. 3.
- The new online-only Division competitions were successfully implemented without any problems or issues. The new process was overseen by Linda Stump and Brian Shepard, and it couldn't have run smoother. Kudos to them and the rest of the division coordinators for their excellent work.

State and Local Affiliates

- Assistance was provided to Kassandra Weleck, president of the Arizona MTA, on the issue of escheatment.
- Counsel was provided to a local association in North Dakota on dealing with a troublesome leadership problem.

Staff and Headquarters

- Teasha O'Connell, Communications Associate, resigned her position in late December, 2018. Her final day was January 10. At this point, a decision to replace the position has not been made.
- On February 26, 2019, Diana Viltrakis, Deputy Executive Director for Administration, submitted her letter of resignation, effective April 5, in order to become a full-time mom. It is a bitter-sweet moment for all of us. Diana has been an integral part of the leadership team over the past six years. Executive Director Ingle relied on her wisdom and judgment in every aspect of his work. She has proven exceptional in every area of extensive responsibilities. But more than that, she is beloved by everyone. She truly was the right person at the right time for the position. We thank her for her exceptional service to MTNA, and wish her the very best.

Division Competitions Recordings Proposal

The Board discussed a suggestion received by Cindy Peterson-Peart to require that a recording made at the state competition would be used for the division round competition. After discussion, the Board took no action.
